

Over Coffee with Kris

For the last thirteen months, I have been lifting up different chapter in the book "Practicing Our Faith" edited by Dorothy Bass. This was a textbook of mine in college, and it was great to look at "faith practices" from a different (older) perspective, 20 years later. Together we looked at honoring the body, hospitality, household economics, saying yes and saying no, keeping sabbath, testimony, discernment, shaping community, forgiveness, healing, dying well, and singing our lives. Bass states "Our deepest desire is to contribute to the search that is going on all around us for the life-giving way of life. We hope that talk about practices can make a difference in the way people walk with one another and with God."

While the point of these faith practices are to improve your relationship with God, they are best not done alone, for they should also improve your relationships with your community of faith, family, and friends. "Whoever seeks to participate in practices structured in response to God must do so in the company of other people. We simply cannot walk with confidence and hope, in these and other difficult matters, all by ourselves. Our perseverance will falter, and our insights will be too limited." We need each other.

Exploring the range and depth of a single practice could take a lifetime. That is partly because each is so rich and various. Practices call for a lifetime of exploration because we are constantly learning more about what it means to do them well – and learning right in the middle of our doing. Entering more deeply into a Christian practice, we do not just learn the practice. When practices are faithful, they teach us surprising things about God, our neighbors, and the world. "Practices are filled with meaning, and the meaning goes far beyond our own spiritual life to touch all the suffering of humanity. Taking part in the Christian practices can cultivate qualities we did not have before and open our eyes and hearts to the activity of God's Spirit in the wider world."

Tips for exploring the faith practices:

- Consider the practice in relation to our basic human needs.
- Consider the ways in which different communities Christian and those of other traditions have shaped this practice.
- Reflect on how the practice enables us to participate in the activity of God's Spirit in the world.
- Be concrete. Observe what people actually do when they are engaged well in a particular practice.
- Find someone to do the practice with; worship together and practice together.


